School Targets

PAC will utilize a systematic focus on instructional rigor to increase achievement. The goal is to improve achievement on MCAP ELA and Math results; however, strategies will also positively impact 1) a reduction in performance gaps and 2) an increase in school culture indicators (e.g., survey results/referrals). The results will be shown in the scores from the final MAP test of the year.

Grade Level ELA Target/Math Target

Prekindergarten 100% of students will expressively identify all uppercase letters

• K-5th Grade 46% of students meet or exceed expectations/45% of students meet or exceed expectations

As discipline issues impact instruction, a goal of reducing discipline referrals by 10% was also included.

Expand the professional capacity of PAC Staff to provide equitable learning opportunities to all students in order help them become determined, independent, and successful learners.

Provide a nurturing and respectful environment for all by integrating student social-emotional and behavioral learning into daily instruction.

Strategies

Data Reviews with individual teachers and grade level teams

- MAP Test Data will be reviewed to identify strengths and weaknesses
- Data will be used to target instruction and place students into Flex groups
- Students who do not show growth will be identified for appropriate interventions, either from Title I or our ELA interventionist
- Dreambox lessons will be assigned to targeted specific areas of focus in math
- A root cause analysis was completed to identify areas of need at PAC

Staff will receive training from various specialist and instructional coaches

- Teachers will meet with ELA specialist Kathy Bumgardner and Math specialist Sue O'Connell for professional development
- Instructional coaches attend PLC meetings and provide instructional supports throughout the year.
- One coach is specifically assigned to PAC and there are four additional coaches that provide support from central office
- Staff will also continue training on the Learning Focused Framework

Changing the culture to "Feed the Good Wolf"

- Students are taught the positive characteristics that come with feeding the good wolf
- These attributes will be discussed in grade level assemblies
- When students display these traits, they can earn positive referrals
- Pawsitive Red Tickets will be given to students displaying appropriate behaviors in high incident areas
- Pawsitive tickets are then collected by class to earn incentives
- The PBIS Committee was reinstated to review data and pinpoint areas of concern
- The Daily Howl we be broadcast each morning to share announcements, positive messages, and unite the Appeal and Patuxent buildings
- Schoolwide Speak Up Days take place throughout the year
- Students learn how to speak up against inequalities they see
- Staff receives training in Restorative Practices and Collaborative and Proactive Solutions
- Increase parent involvement in surveys in order to identify concerns
